### ARTICLE III.

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1 - Number. Election, and Term of Office:

a. The number of directors of the Corporation shall be no less than five (5) and no more than seven (7), unless and until otherwise determined by vote of a majority of the entire membership.

b. The directors of the Corporation shall be elected by the members at the annual meeting of the membership.

c. There shall be no term limit for directors.

d. There shall be three (3) directors that hold two (2) year terms and two (2) directors that hold three (3) year terms . These terms of office shall be staggered so that not more than two (2) directors vacate office in any year.

d. Each director shall serve (3) year terms. These terms of office shall be staggered so that not more than three (3) directors vacate office in any year.

e. Each director shall hold office until the annual meeting next succeeding his-their election, and until his-their successor is elected and qualified, or until his-their prior death, resignation, or removal.

Members are officially notified of proposed changes to the Maah Daah Hey Trail Association By-Laws and published here at least 30 days ahead of the April 23, 2022 Annual Meeting to be held at the Eagles Club, 31 1st Ave E, Dickinson, ND. Changes are found within Article III, Section 1, Part d, and e. Text to be removed is struck through and the new proposed wording is in red.

The reason for the new wording is the original Part d is difficult to implement and confusing. The new wording makes the length of the directors' terms uniform and easier to follow while assuring that a majority of directors is never up for election in any one year so continuity and Association knowledge within MDHTA leadership is maintained.

The reason for the change in wording in Part e is to recognize that directors can be either male or female.

MDHTA board of directors recommends the general membership amend MDHTA By-Laws as presented below.

The USFS has hired three trail crew members for the 2022 field season. We will be working with the Montana Conservation Corps at the end of April to construct both a spur trail and new trailhead at the Buffalo Gap. The new Buffalo Gap spur trail and trailhead will help alleviate the congestion that occurs at the Buffalo Gap campground. This improvement will allow easier access by trail users to the Buffalo Gap trail and the MDH with their preferred mode of use.


MM 115-133.5 on the MDH trail will see major restoration and rehabilitation by contractors this coming season. MM 115 is located north of the trail's intersection with FS Road 809 and MM 133.5 is at the south boundary of the Theodore Roosevelt National Park North Unit. Switchback reconstruction, trail benching, water diversion bars and trail braiding rehab are among some of the maintenance that will be performed on this long section of the MDH, which is very much needed in this remote area.

In addition to the work outlined above there will be a 1.5 mile reroute of the MDH on the Pioneer Gulch drainage at MM 69.5 that will be constructed by both contractors and USFS trail crew. Work includes 2,600 ft of new trail excavation, 4,400 ft of trail mowing, 550 ft of trail brushing, two new switchbacks, and 25 rolling grade dips.

We will be coordinating with the MDHTA on new RTP contracts for the 2023 field season this coming Spring as well.
